Bornholm Art Museum, Denmark www.bornholms-kunstmuseum.dk situated on the native island of the artist Kristian Zahrtmann, who became honorary citizen in Civita d'Antino in 1902, is a national certified, recognized art museum supported by the state and by the local authorities. The main focus of the museum is on Kristian Zahrtmann and his students, who formed the breakthrough of modernistic painting in Denmark.

The museum holds a vast collection of Danish and international art including the worldwide largest collection of works by Kristian Zahrtmann as well as numerous works by his most important students and fellow artists.

The Palazzo Ferrante plays an important role in this development.
